Introduction

Paul Schaefer was foremost wilderness conservationist for New York's Adirondacks during the 20th century, and a master builder and restorer of fine American homes and Adirondack camps. Schaefer was an Adirondack guide, hunter, photographer, film-maker, author and premier conservationist, with a national reputation for protecting the Adirondacks' wild river valleys and wilderness areas and defending New York's unique "forever wild" Forest Preserve. Schaefer was recognized after his death as one of the 100 top conservationists of the century by *Audubon* magazine. Recipient of dozens of awards and author of three books about the Adirondacks, the name Paul Schaefer is synonymous with Adirondack conservation as well as with rustic homes that blend into their environments.
