

NYS Population Growth/Loss of 0 to 14 Years Olds 2000 - 2010




U.S. Population Growth/Loss of 0 to 14 Years Olds 2000 - 2010






The number of 0 to 14 years olds in the U.S. population increased slightly short-term from 2000 to 2010, from 59.67 million to 60.6 million. This growth was not evenly distributed as the great majority of counties in the U.S. saw a drop in their number of 0 to 14 year olds from 2000 to 2010. Generally, metropolitian areas saw some growth, rural areas saw losses.

The number of 25 to 44 years olds in the U.S. population dropped slightly from 2000 to 2010, from 84.6 million to 81.3 million in 2010. The loss of 25 to 44 year olds was widespread in these years, with pockets of growth in the South and Southwest.
